We are quickly approaching the deadline for Teaching Elder Commissioners, Ruling Elder Commissioners, and Young Adult Advisory Delegates applications to General Assembly. **The Deadline is September 30, 2013.**

The 221<sup>st</sup> General Assembly is June 15- June 21, 2014 in Detroit, MI. To do this exciting work of the church, Heartland Presbytery is entitled to three Teaching Elder (Pastor) Commissioners, three Ruling Elder Commissioners, and one YAAD. Alternatives will also be selected for each position. If someone has been an alternate in the past, they are defiantly encouraged to apply again.

Any Teaching Elder who meets the qualifications can apply. Ruling Elders who qualify may be nominated by their church, or may nominate themselves. YAAD’s must be nominated by their church, youth director, etc. This procedure for Teaching Elders and Ruling Elders is more open than it has been in the past, allowing for broader participation.

The entire trip and all expenses will be paid. There will be training sessions provided for Commissioners and YAAD’s. Please read the qualifications and applications carefully, and let us hear from you.
